# NATIONAL CONVENTION

Communications Chair Pat Watt attended the LWVUS National Convention June 16-19, 2016, at the Marriot Woodley Park Hotel in Washington DC. According to Watt, 680 delegates attended from 47 states. An additional 150 volunteers, non-voting delegates, and staff also attended. Watt was joined by others from Alaska: Gail Knopf, of Kenai, Mary Rosenzweig, of Anchorage, and Hetty Barthel, State Board/Juneau).

Business was conducted at four Plenary sessions where attendees heard from a number of speakers on topics including: budget, elections, bylaws, program planning and resolutions. Caucus and workshop topics included converting from 501(c)4 to 501(c)3 status, League Easy Web (LEW), website options, training on how to use Naturalization ceremonies for impact and Vote411.org.
