LWV Alaska Update: carolyn reported on the ERA and VRAA grants' progress. Radio spots have been produced as well as visual spots created by Pat Race for social media. All have been accomplished within budget. A special website, attached to the LWV Juneau site, will be launched July 20th.

<u>Bus Placards:</u> carolyn reported on her research regarding placing placards in city buses educating riders on the how-tos of voting in the upcoming elections. 11 x 26 placards would cost \$17 each. CBJ has okayed the placing of placards. There is concern about the effectiveness of relaying the information in this manner, realizing that bus ridership is down due to COVID and the difficulty of processing the potentially confusing information in that setting. Possible placard text will be developed. This item has been put on the August Agenda for further discussion and vote.

Summary of "Yes on 2 for Better Elections"

The ballot initiative would:

1. End Dark Money - Alaska has a small population, as compared to other states, but we have the same number of Senators as all states. Therefore we are attractive to outsider influencers who wish to buy seats in the Senate. Ending Dark Money, were the true source of funds is not known, would help to end outside influence.

The ballot initiative would (continued):

- 2. Institute a top 4, single primary ballot (all candidates regardless of party affiliation on one ballot), open to all Alaskan voters
- 3. Rank choice voting in general election; 50% threshold (50% plus one votes needed for a candidate to be declared the winner)

Result: More choice, transparency, and power for Alaska voters

Other Benefits to this Election Reform:

- 1. Eases transition to Vote By Mail Only one ballot needed to send to all voters
- 2. Make Partisan redistricting obsolete
- 3. Results in more diversity among those elected; more women and more BIPOC
- 4. Increases Primary turnout, which in turn increases General turnout
- 5. Results in a safe bipartisan space for big solutions to big problems
