### **Highlights - Short on time? Read this first!**

#### House moves fast on Education - What IS the BSA?

Listen to the <u>House Education Committee</u> who heard a presentation by Alexi Painter, Legislative Finance Director. He went through the make-up of the BSA. Everyone wants an increase, but what impact would that have across the districts? Is there a better way? How is it determined, when was it last updated?

No time to listen? Download the <u>Legislative powerpoint</u> and a report from the <u>Institute of Social and Economic Research</u> who's final summary says, "We could spend a lot more and still not produce desired outcomes." And "Reducing spending without changing how dollars are spent will likely harm outcomes." Read it through.

Then read the proposed <u>HB69</u>. More meetings starting 8:00 am Monday, with **Public Testimony Wednesday evening**, **5:00 pm on** <u>HB69</u>. Read more Week 1 highlights below.

There was a special joint session of the House and Senate Affairs meeting. Carol Beecher presented. *Highly recommend that you <u>listen</u> to this one to hear the questions asked*. Presentation <u>here</u>.

#### What's New

**State House:** There is a new 21 member majority in the House made up of 14 Democrats, five independents, and two Republicans (Rep. Kopp (R-Anchorage) and Rep. Stutes (R-Kodiak)). This majority elected Rep. Bryce Edgmon (I-Dillingham) as Speaker. The new coalition Majority Leader is Rep. Charles Kopp. Rep. Kopp is a former Alaska State House member. The minority is led by Rep. Mia Costello (R-Anchorage). Rep. Costello is a former Alaska State Senator and former Representative.

**State Senate:** There is a new bi-partisan majority coalition in the State Senate with 14 members this year (down from 17 last session). It consists of five Republicans and nine Democrats led by Senate President Sen. Gary Stevens (R-Kodiak) and Sen. Cathy Giessel (R-Anchorage) as Majority Leader. There are six Republicans in the State Senate minority led by Sen. Mike Shower, (R-Wasilla).

#### Bills released first week of session

As of the end of the first week, there are 24 Education-related bills, and eleven (11) Election related-bills. We'll be watching these as they move forward. There is one Campaign Finance bill (<u>HB16</u>), and one regarding guns in schools (SB03).

#### Governor's Budget

In December, Governor Dunleavy released his budget for the first session of the 34th Legislature. He is recommending a \$3,892 PFD. This budget brings with it an over \$1.7 billion deficit (more by some accounts), leaving it up to the Legislature to decide how and what to fund. He suggested no revenue to offset the costs.

The Governor has outlined his budget this way. This does not provide for an increase in the BSA, instead providing funding in some other ways.

Education

- Total investment in K-12 Education \$1.5 billion
- \$1.1 billion in K-12 Foundation Formula (encompasses "BSA") funding and \$67.8 million for Pupil Transportation
- \$2.75 million in continued support for Career and Technical Education, Teacher Apprenticeships, and Teacher Recruitment and Retention Initiatives
- \$300,000 for Electrician and Plumber career pathway development for students
- \$5 million for the University of Alaska Fairbanks toward achieving R1 Status
