



A lull before the storm....

As of Monday, May 5th, there are only 17 days left in the session. The budget bills are wrapping up. Both budgets will likely end up in conference committees to hash out final details. And, usually, the last few days are a mad dash to complete what they can. Many bills will be pushed to the next session where it is likely the state will face even more budget challenges.

The impacts of federal funding cuts are just now starting to be felt and the full impacts are not yet known. The Senate has already started to signal that any bills with budget impacts stand a very slim chance of passing.

Convention Update

If you missed the convention this year, you missed some really great presentations. Amy Gallaway and Fawn Jelinek, both retired public school teachers, professional development teachers, and board members of Kids Voting North – discussed civics education. We had videos from our State Senators and Representative, and we heard from State Senator Cathy Giessel and the "State of the State." It was an important and timely budget discussion. Finally, we had a panel of journalists, led by Lori Townsend who discussed: "How can public broadcasting and local newspapers compete with social media for voters/citizens attention?" Education

As you all know by now, the Governor vetoed the education bill <u>HB69 (Education Funding: Increase BSA)</u>. Undeterred, the Senate added a \$700 BSA increase into <u>HB57: Communication Devices in Public Schools</u>, and added some language for charter schools and class sizes. It passed the Senate with a 17-3 vote, and passed

the House with a 31-8 vote. It was sent to the Governor on May 1, due back by May 19th. No word on whether he'll veto it again. If those vote margins hold, that would be enough to override a veto, but, no guarantees that would be the case, as we learned last year.

Still more Education bills

The House_Education Committee will be hearing a more education bills heading into the end of session. A couple to watch are <u>HB 212: Local Contributions by School Districts</u> and <u>HB 59: State Tribal Education Compacts</u>. Both of these bills will be heard this week (see schedule below).

Elections

<u>SB64 (Elections)</u> is still sitting in the Senate Finance Committee. It may not come up again until close to the end of the session, and we may not get much notice when it does.

Campaign Finance

One bill still moving is HB 16: Campaign Finance Contribution Limits. This bill passed the house on April 28th with a 22-18 majority. Per the sponsor statement: "House Bill 16 (HB 16) reinstates fair, reasonable, and constitutional campaign contribution limits, which will be adjusted based on Alaska's consumer price index rates moving forward. This will ensure that these limits remain constitutional." The bill was sent to the Senate where Senate Finance Committee heard it on May 1st. It was heard and held. Changes are expected. However, as with the elections bill, it could be brought up in committee at any time without much time to review the changes.
